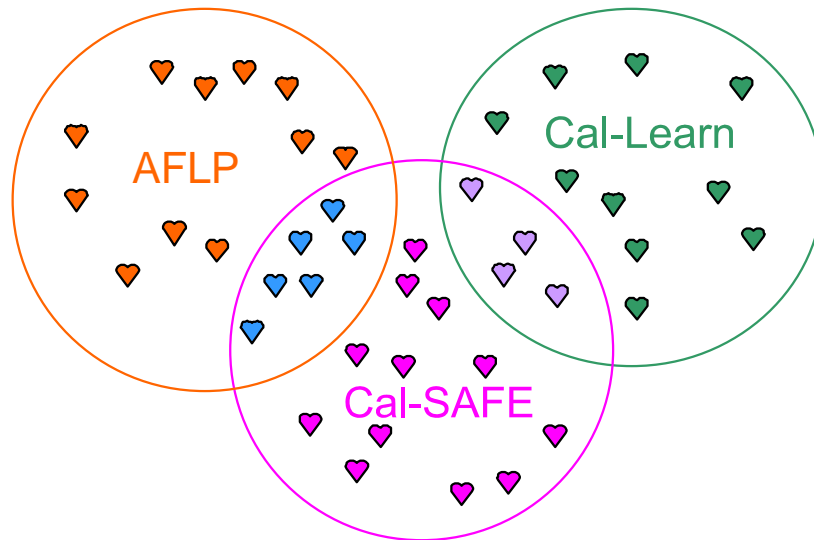


This Venn diagram illustrates the relationship between three programs serving expectant and parenting adolescents and their children. The Cal-Learn program is funded through the California Department of Social Services (DSS), the Adolescent Family Life Program through the California Department of Health Services (DHS), and the Cal Safe Program through the California Department of Education (CDE).



These sweethearts are enrolled in the Adolescent Family Life Program (AFLP). They are not Cal-SAFE students. They may not be enrolled in school, or if in school may live in AFLP's service area, but not in the school district that has a Cal-SAFE program. Since Cal-SAFE is voluntary they may have chosen not to participate in the Cal-SAFE program.



These students are enrolled in the Cal-SAFE program and are not enrolled in AFLP or Cal-Learn. If these students need similar services that are offered by AFLP or Cal-Learn such as case management, Cal-SAFE can pay for them, either directly or by contract with another agency. The contracting agency may be the agency that operates the AFLP or Cal-Learn program, but because the student is not receiving aid (TANF) funds and is not in Cal-Learn or in AFLP's months of service (the AFLP caseload cap) Cal-SAFE pays. Some of these students may not be receiving all of the services that AFLP and Cal-Learn clients receive because there is not an assessed need for those services.



These hearts represent Cal-Learn Clients that are not enrolled in Cal-SAFE. They may have aged out of Cal-SAFE but still be eligible for Cal-Learn. They may not be enrolled in school, or if in school, not in the school district that has a Cal-SAFE program. They are mandatory clients of Cal-Learn and are eligible for Cal-Learn services: case management, child care, transportation, etc.



These Cal-SAFE students are also Cal-Learn clients. Recipients of aid, they must participate in the Cal-Learn Program. They will receive incentives or sanctions for school achievement. They have Cal-Learn case managers and are eligible for other Cal-Learn services. Some of these services may be the same as those that are allowable for funding by Cal-SAFE. Cal-SAFE programs should work with the Cal-Learn agency to avoid duplication of services for these students and coordinate services to maximize available funding.



AFLP Clients that are enrolled in Cal-SAFE are represented here. Each AFLP Client is assigned a case manager. It is important that case management is not duplicated by Cal-SAFE. Several support services that are allowable under Cal-SAFE and child care and development services are not funded through AFLP. Cal-SAFE programs should work with the AFLP agency to ensure that there is no duplication of services for these students and coordinate services to maximize available funding.
